Baraboo, Wisconsin Trip | February 10-12, 2023

February 10 to 12, 2023 will be a weekend trip to Baraboo, WI. We will be staying at the Clarion Hotel and Convention Center. A block of rooms is reserved until January 10 under East Iowa Ski Club. Rates are \$99 a night for a King room and \$89 per night for a room with two queens. Call the hotel directly at 608-356-6422 to make your reservations.

Lift ticket rates have now been set at Cascade and Devil's Head. Weekend rates are \$89 daily for an adult at Cascade. The rates at Devil's Head are \$50 a day if you are a Super Senior (66+), \$68 daily or \$121 for 2 days if you are a Senior (60-65), and \$78 daily or \$141 for a 2-day ticket for adults (13-60). Both locations REQUIRE tickets to be purchased IN ADVANCE ON-LINE.

The East Iowa Ski Club's Copper Mountain February 20 – 26th trip currently has one opening, due to a cancelation. Please hurry and sign up if you would like to join the Copper Mountain group.

Dale and Rhonda Bohrer will be leading this EISC ski adventure. There is room for 24 members of the EISC to stay in Mountain Plaza

complex in the Center Village. We have 6 condos, 2br/2bth in this walk-in/walk-out location - across the plaza from the lifts (3-minute walk). A rooming list is being created and transportation plans are being finalized.

The cost of the final spot on the Copper Mtn trip is \$1164 w/ condo & 5 of 6 days of lifts or \$750 w/ condo only.

This EISC trip is scheduled as a six-night, Monday through Sunday, Feb 20 - 26; drive yourself/carpool trip. We have the option to park at the resort early Monday (2/20/23), ski all day and check in later that afternoon. This should work out great for those who want to travel to the Denver area on Sunday, then drive into Copper Mountain early for skiing on Monday morning and avoid the weekend traffic. The club got special group pricing on the condos with this unusual schedule and five of six-day lift tickets.

Niagara Falls by Motorcoach May 13-20, 2023

Ski season is upon us but it's not too early to start planning next year's non ski trips. On May 13th, we load our Motor Coach from Cedar Rapids for a scenic tour up through Wisconsin, Michigan and into Canada on our way to Niagara Falls – with a variety of fun stops along the way. This trip includes our own private motor coach, hotel accommodations, breakfasts at each hotel stay, five dinner meals, and all ticket and entrance fees. A more detailed itinerary follows:

Day 1: we depart at 8:00 am from Cedar Rapids for our first travel day to Escanaba, Michigan. It's an easy 400-mile trip up through Madison and Green Bay so we will arrive in plenty of time to relax and have dinner. We might even find a local winery to tour.

Day 2: we're off for a short 2 ½ hour ride to Paradise, Michigan where we visit the Great Lakes Shipwreck Museum. It's only an hour ride from there down to Mackinaw City. On our way we will stop at the Soo Locks in Sault Ste. Marie hoping to see one of the ships going through the locks. Then it's to our hotel and dinner in Mackinaw City

Day 3: we get on the Mackinac Island Ferry for a tour of Mackinac Island, and then back for a bus tour of Mackinaw City, and back to our same hotel and dinner.

Day 4: we're off to Dearborn and the Henry Ford Museum. We have a 4-hour bus ride so there is plenty of time to go through the museum before we head for our hotel and dinner for the night.

Day 5: is off to Niagara Falls through Canada. It's a 4-hour ride but it might be a little longer getting through Canada customs on our way. We will have time in the afternoon to explore some of the area before arriving at our hotel and dinner.

Day 6: will be touring more of the Niagara Falls sites, and then back to our hotel again.

Day 7: is an early morning for our ride to Cleveland to tour Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Museum before we find our hotel and dinner.

Day 8: we are on our way home. It's a longer day but we get home on a Saturday so those that are still working can rest up for the day before going back to work Monday.

Registrations for this trip started at the November meeting so we are off to a good start at making this trip a go.

We will need 20 people to make this trip work. You can send your deposit check to EISC at PO Box 843, Cedar Rapids, IA 52406, or register online. We set this trip up as double occupancy so please let us know your roommate choice when signing up.

Out West-Black Hills and National Parks Trip - August 20-29, 2023

Total Trip Price | \$2,480 double occupancy 1st Payment | \$620 due at signup 2nd Payment | \$620 due February 17, 2023 3rd Payment | \$620 due April 15, 2023 4th Payment | \$620 due May 19, 2023 Cancellation Date | May 19th, 2023

This trip begins with a flight from Cedar Rapids to Rapid City, SD, where a motor coach, (driven by club favorite bus driver, Dale Scharping) will be waiting for us. We will begin the trip with a close up look of the Badlands NP and a short stop at famous Wall Drug. Day 2 will be spent exploring the Black Hills with stops at Custer State Park, Wind Cave NP, Crazy Horse and Mt Rushmore, and an overnight stay in Deadwood, SD known for its casinos, restaurants and museums. The next day we are headed to Cody, WY where we will take in the Buffalo Bill Museum, and the Cody Nighttime Rodeo, etc. Day 4 and 5 will be spent exploring and hiking in Yellowstone NP. The Day 5 overnight will be spent on an actual dude ranch, ideally located between Yellowstone NP and the Grand Tetons

NP. Day 6 will be spent exploring the Tetons with optional opportunities for river rafting and horseback riding. Following a night in Salt Lake City, we will spend the remainder of the trip exploring Capital Reef NP, Canyonlands NP and the Arches NP with three overnights in Moab, UT. On our final day, we will take in the Colorado National Monument before catching our flight back home from Grand Junction, CO.

The cost for this 9-night, 10-day trip is \$2480 and it includes: airfare, bus transportation, all lodging, eight breakfasts, five group dinners, the rodeo and all park admission fees. We will travel through five states and six national parks. The first deposit is \$620, followed by 3 additional payments of \$620, with a cancellation date of May 19th. There are 20 spots available for this trip.
