Keystone Becomes Crested Butte: Jan 23-30

On Friday, Dec. 18th, we were notified by SKI.com that Summit County, CO extended the Code Red COVID restrictions through Jan. 19. Our Keystone trip was scheduled to start on Jan. 23rd. There were several tough restrictions, but the one that hit us the hardest is 1 family per condo rule, which we can't meet. We knew there were some restrictions in

place, but these were expected to be cancelled on Dec. 17, as the virus numbers had been improving. Things got more restrictive instead. Our options were limited.

- We could wait until Jan. 19, hope for the best and see what happens. The most likely change was limiting it to 2 families per condo if the goals were met.
- We could go to Crested Butte resort on the western slope which is another Vail Resort, doesn't have restrictions and has rooms available at the Plaza – a ski-in / walk-out condo that would be an additional 3 to 4 hour drive.
- We could try to delay the Keystone trip to early March and see if conditions improve.
- We could cancel the west trip for the year and work with Vail Resorts & put in for refunds

We surveyed the members signed up for the trip for their choice and moving the trip to Crested Butte was chosen. Twenty-two EISC members of the 26 that had signed up for Keystone decided to make the switch. Crested Butte is an additional 3 to 4 hours of drive time than Keystone and is on the western slope of the mountains. The EISC had visited Crested Butte in 2014 & stayed at the Plaza condos. Only a couple of people on this trip were on the 2014 trip, remembered for the deep snow that sometimes hits Crested Butte. The resort has grown and changed some over the past 6 years, but has maintained the uncrowded, friendly & slightly crazy feeling.

Located off the beaten path, Crested Butte is known for some of the best lift-served terrain in the nation. There are few places that can still be called a real Colorado ski town, and Crested Butte is one of them. Walking around town, you'll feel it in the unparalleled views and the

meticulously preserved false-front buildings reminiscent of its mining days. Crested Butte got its start as a mining town in the 1880s. It was once called "the town that wouldn't die" because of its ability to survive the booms and busts of Colorado's mining days. With 15 lifts serving 1,547 acres, Crested Butte has 121 trails covering over a 3000 ft. vertical drop. The runs are 18% Beginner, 29% Intermediate, 21% Advanced, and 32% Expert so there is something for everyone. There are many non-skier activities for you to enjoy as well- surrounded by 1.7 million acres of National Forest, you can snowshoe, fat bike, and cross country ski - right out your front door in any direction. The club will be staying in 2 and 3 bedroom condos in The Plaza – a ski-in / walk-out complex about 100 yards from the Silver Queen and Red Lady Express Lifts. The Plaza is one of Crested Butte Mountain Resort's premier lodging accommodations and offers more amenities than other condominiums in Crested Butte. This is the first time the club has tried a drive yourself trip to Colorado and now the COVID restrictions have forced us to change our resort and condo location a month from the start of the trip. This is quite an accomplishment in schedule & travel flexibility for the intrepid members of the EISC. We were fortunate to retain Kathy Takes, as the Trip Leader and added her daughter, Kari Wheeler as the Assistant Trip Leader for this adventure. Kathy has worked hard on the communication aspects of the location switch process on this trip. The attitudes have been great & this has all the makings of an excellent ski trip to Crested Butte, Colorado!

Guidelines For East Iowa Ski Club

Whether you are a novice skier, an expert skier, snowboarder, cross-country skier, snow-shoer, or never wanted to be on a ski slope, you will find skiing and non-ski activities geared to your interests and abilities. Join us and enjoy the camaraderie of some of the greatest people in this state. We guarantee a good time or double your efforts back!

BECOMING A MEMBER...

To be a member of the East Iowa Ski Club requires a completed membership form and the payment of annual dues. Our website is eastiowaskiclub.com and mailing address is East Iowa Ski Club, PO Box 843, Cedar Rapids, IA 52506-3162. Annual dues are good for 12 months from the date you joined.

- \$30 for an individual 18 years and over
- \$60 for a household (everyone living in one household, including under 18)
- \$5 for a one-time Trial membership, good for 3 months to new members only

There are some events where membership is not necessary, however you are required to register. All guests sign in at every meeting.

TO SIGN UP FOR AN ACTIVITY...

- 1) Talk with the trip chairperson, sign up and arrange payment.
- 2) On the website, log-in, select the activity from the event calendar and register. You can send a check to the PO Box or pay with a credit card on-line.
- *A full deposit or first payment must be made for your position to be held on the list of trip takers.
- *If the activity/trip chairperson takes your name but no money, you are on the waiting list only. The trip could sell out before you are contacted!

WAITING LIST...

As trips fill, activity chairpersons accumulate additional names for a waiting list. The names are kept in order of receipt, and members are notified in that order when a vacancy occurs on the trip. We cannot guarantee spaces for people on the waiting list, so get your money in early. You can accept a position that opens or decline; you are not under obligation.

EVENT PRICES AND ROOM ARRANGEMENTS...

Your EISC works diligently to offer you the lowest trip rates obtainable. Please remember that all trip prices are subject to change.

Sleeping arrangements in condos or hotels are normally one queen or 2 twins, we attempt to match up beds to couples/singles. For this reason, we advise you to come prepared with your roommate. In the event you don't, we will attempt to place you with a same-sex roommate; however, it is not guaranteed. If you would prefer to room by yourself or don't have a roommate in mind, you have the option to pay the single supplement charge. All trip takers look forward to their vacations and pay a lot of money to participate, SO in consideration of others, ONLY paid trip participants are eligible to stay overnight in a condo/hotel.

TRIP INSURANCE...

Insurance is recommended and available to purchase via the travel agency that designs our ski trips, or it is also available from travel insurance websites.

CROSS COUNTRY SKIING SNOWSHOEING...

Trip chairpersons try to indicate the availability of cross country and snowshoeing trails. Please let the trip chairperson know if you intend to cross country and/or snowshoe.

REFUND/CANCELLATION POLICY...

*Authorized cancellation: If a trip taker notifies the trip chairperson of intent to cancel before the deadline established for that trip, all monies paid will be refunded.

*<u>Late cancellation</u> – If a trip taker cancels after the established cancellation date for the trip <u>and</u> notifies the trip chairperson, a refund MAY be granted, provided a fully paid replacement is found. If no replacement is found, the cancelling trip taker is responsible for unrecoverable costs.

*Unauthorized cancellation – A person who does not notify the trip chairperson forfeits the cost of the trip.

RESPECTABILITY...



We've always offered the mail-in paper ballot option for those who can't make the February Member Meeting. This year, that will be everyone. So, read the candidate profiles and select four. Most of you are receiving this Skiddoo electronically. If you have a printer, you can just print off the last page that has the ballot on it and mail that in. Since it is possible that some may not have printers, we are also allowing people to create their own ballots on any piece of writing paper and send that in. The mailing envelope must have a legible name and return address so a record can be kept of who has voted. (Multiple members within a single household can place ballots in the same envelope, but then they would have to be signed or contained within an additional privacy envelope that is signed.)

Be sure to have your ballots mailed in time to be post-marked no later than February 19.
