Welch Village/Twin Cities Jan.21, 2022 ski weekend cancelled

The EISC Midwest ski trip the weekend of Jan. 21 – 23 has been canceled. We hated to cancel and tried to make this work, but at the Sept 18 Kickoff meeting it became obvious we would not be able to support this trip.

We were unable to find a bus for the weekend that was financially feasible, so we made it a drive yourself trip. We did get a good price on rooms at the Country Inn & Suites at the Mall of America. The Welch Village lift ticket fee is \$69 per day. If we could have been sure we would get 20 skiers to sign up, the group rate was \$45 per day.

The Welch lift ticket system requires everyone to buy the ticket on-line signing the release that way. This requires everyone to sign up with all name, address, email, and cell number information. For those who would have signed up for the group rate, if we would have failed to reach the 20-skier minimum, everyone would be charged the full \$69 per day amount. There were only three skiers at the meeting that were planning on going.

Thank you to Kay Hess for volunteering to lead this trip – hopefully the next Midwest weekend ski trip will work out better. Thank you to the board members who worked on a hotel contract and with Welch Village to get a good group rate, if we would have had enough Midwest skiers.

It was pointed out that many members have ordered season or weekday passes to Sundown Mountain Ski Area in Dubuque this year. The club plans to announce several ski days / trips to Sundown using the ski forum feature on the EISC website. Please watch for announcements of upcoming day ski trips this coming season.




Please note that Epic pass prices will increase Oct 14th.

The first major EISC West trip of the 2022 season is back to Breckenridge! This area has activities for skiers and non-skiers. Breckenridge is a very unique town with a variety of activities available. The towns of Fisco and Silverthorn are also within a 15-minute drive.

This mountain offers fantastic skiing for all abilities and is spread out over 2,908 acres, which includes five peaks!

A new chairlift has been added this year to Peak Seven. It will make navigating the mountain much easier! As well as relieving the congestion at the base of peak Seven.





There are also groomed cross country and snow shoeing paths located along the base of the mountain.

We have 31 people registered so far, with room for 32. We will be staying in eight 2BR/2Bath suites at the Beaver Run resort. This ski in/ski out resort is one of Breckenridge's most popular.

The Beaver Run Resort offers a variety of amenities including an indoor/outdoor heated pool, a second outdoor pool, nine outdoor hot tubs, an exercise room, video arcade, retail stores, mini market/deli, bars and restaurants, ski and snowboard rental shops and complimentary in-town shuttle.

Parking is restricted during the winter to one vehicle per bedroom at a \$20 per day fee, so carpooling is suggested to keep the cost down.

EISC members will have to order their own Epic passes online. The EISC recommends using the [SKI.com](https://epicikon.events.ski.com/) link <https://epicikon.events.ski.com/> to buy your pass as [SKI.com](https://epicikon.events.ski.com/) offers a credit of \$30 on all Epic (except the Epic Day) Passes, when used on one of the EISC ski trips.

Epic passes are currently 20% off last year's prices. The price will increase on October 14.

CSMC Picnic - August 28


