EPIC Pass / Vail Resorts Group updates summary

The EISC will be going to Breckenridge and Park City resorts this year – both are part of the Epic Pass / Vail Resorts group. Below are some of the updated guidelines that were sent out to Epic Pass holders, but will apply to everyone on the trip. Thanks, Steve

- **No Mountain Access Reservations Needed**: Unlike last year, pass holders do not need a mountain access reservation.
- Lifts and Gondolas Will Be Loaded at Normal Capacity:.
- **Bring a Face Covering:** Face coverings are required indoors around the resort. They are not required while you're skiing, riding, or on a chairlift or *gondola".

- Vaccinations Required in Indoor Cafeteria-Style Restaurants: You will be required to show proof of vaccination to dine at our indoor cafeteria-style restaurants. Guests can show a vaccination card, a photo of a vaccination card on their phone, or an authorized vaccination verification mobile app. Guests 18 and over will also need to show a government issued photo ID (or an Epic Pass).. *Vaccinations are not required at our full-service or outdoor restaurants.
- **Make Your Dining Reservation:** Many of our on-mountain restaurants are requiring reservations. You can book them the day before on the resort's dining webpage, the **<u>EpicMix App</u>** or through QR codes at the resort.

Epic Pass Holders receive 20% off at these restaurants at **Breckenridge Resort**:

- Maggie's Food Court / Overlook Restaurant / Pioneer Crossing QS / The Coop / Ski Hill Grill
- Tenmile Station (R) / Vista Haus Cafeteria

Yes – you get four full days of fishing on this trip but on your off days, you could go golfing on the nearby 18-hole courses or bike riding on the nearby trails. Your Coast Guard Licensed guide will take care of all your fishing needs including putting you on the fish. With over 14,500 islands, 65,000 miles of shoreline, and nearly one million acres of water you will appreciate the 200 years of guide experience between all their guides.

You can either carpool, or drive yourselves to Baudette, Minnesota leaving Saturday, July 30th. Check in time is 3:00 pm. You will just want to get there in time for dinner. You will depart for home on the next Saturday, August 6th.
